



Fr. Arnel's Reflections - Fifth Sunday of Lent Ezekiel 37:12-14; Psalm 130:1-6b, 7b-8; Romans 8:8-11





The theme of the readings this Sunday is God's gift of spiritual awakening and transformation that leads to "new life" in an intimate covenant relationship with God.

The *First Reading* is taken from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel. At the time of this story, the people of Israel are captives in Babylon, languishing as if they were "dry bones in the desert." Through this vision of the dry bones, God tells the Prophet to announce that He will in time restore the exiled people of Judah. This will not be a return to their former status and shame under the Monarchy, but to a "new life" governed

not by kings and princes but by the Holy Spirit dwelling within them.

The *Responsorial Psalm* is one of the seven penitential Psalms used in various liturgies in which God promises to redeem His people from their past iniquities. This Psalm continues the theme of "new life." This carries the promise that God will redeem His people from their sins and give them a "new life" through a new covenant relationship with Him. Hence, this is an instruction to all the People of God to wait patiently in hope for the Lord's redemption.

In the *Second Reading* which is taken from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans, Saint Paul gives the Romans and all of us an updated teaching similar to that of the Prophet Ezekiel above. "Updated" because this writing comes from a time after the Resurrection of Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit has been poured out on all mankind to guide us back to the Father. If we do not have the Spirit dwelling within us, we will be like those "dry bones in the desert."

The raising of Lazarus from the dead in the *Gospel Reading* is a sign of victory of Jesus over death that He accomplished in His bodily resurrection from the grave. This is the Good News. Death has no power over Lazarus, because of Jesus, and death has no power over Jesus, because He too rose from the dead. His resurrection is the proof or the evidence, that sin and death have been conquered.

This is also a sign of the hope of the promised "new life" that awaits all of us who follow Christ by submitting to a spiritual rebirth through water and the Spirit in the Sacrament of Baptism. It is also the promise of the bodily resurrection of the dead at the end of time when Christ returns to claim His Church and raise her to glory.

Life From God

As we approach Holy Week, our readings speak of a God who, in the midst of death, brings new life to the people. In Ezekiel, we hear that God will open the graves of the



people of Israel, who faced near extinction. In the Gospel of John, Jesus gives new life to Lazarus in a manner that prefigures the resurrection of Jesus. Saint Paul tells the Romans that in Christ, God will not only give life to our bodies after death but God offers us abundant life here and now. We observe that the external conditions for the people described in these readings did not radically

change. Israel was still in exile; Lazarus would eventually face death again; but now God's presence and power are revealed. Even when our situation in life is difficult and perhaps not likely to change soon, we remember that the Spirit dwells within us.

The Practice of Stewardship

When Jesus heard about the illness of His friend, Lazarus, He responded, "This illness is not to end in death; rather it is for God's glory, that through it the Son of God may be glorified." Every aspect of our lives - our gifts as well as our sufferings - can, if surrendered to Christ, lead to blessing for others and ourselves.

With Mass next Saturday evening, we enter

Holy Week. Next Sunday is Palm Sunday, a day to remember the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. Are we moved to enter into the holiest of all weeks, the most sacred of days, the time of reconciliation? So that we might be forgiven, we must first look at those who have sinned against us and embrace them with tears of forgiveness.



On this final Sunday of Lent before Palm Sunday, we hear Jesus call Lazarus forth from the tomb.

Jesus calls us as well, calls us forth from our tombs of sin and death, where our harmful habits and attitudes separate us from God, from life. He is the resurrection.

He is the life. Jesus' words to Martha then are His words to us now: "Do you believe this? Do you believe that God can bring life out of death? Do you believe that God can free us from the burial bands of sin?"

Let us recover that faith within us and so prepare ourselves to witness the Resurrection.

Question of the Week:

What spiritual darkness is Jesus calling me to come out of today? What difficulties can I anticipate in shedding these burial bands that separate me from God's grace?

The Fridays of Lent are to be meatless for all Catholics.


