



Fr. Arnel's Reflections - Seventh Sunday of Easter Acts 1:12-14; Psalm 27:1, 4, 7-8; 1 Peter 4:13-16; John 17:1-11a

ALLELUIA!



The Resurrected Christ taught His Church for forty days, preparing His Apostles and disciples to fulfill their mission to carry the Gospel of Salvation from Jerusalem to the ends of the earth. Jesus promised them that they would not be alone in their mission. At the end of the forty days, just before His Ascension into Heaven, Jesus "enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem but to wait for 'the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

In the *First Reading*, after Ascension of Jesus to the Father, in obedience to His command, with the Virgin Mary, the Apostles and disciples gathered in the Upper Room in Jerusalem. There they prayed daily for nine days, awaiting the coming of the Holy Spirit, the other Advocate Jesus promised to send to guide His Church.


The Holy Spirit was present at the Incarnation when He overshadowed the Virgin, which led to the birth of the Messiah. It is fitting, therefore, that disciples of Jesus should be praying with His mother while waiting for what will be the activity of then Spirit in the birth of the New Covenant Church. It is Mary, after all, who became the "Mother" of His disciples when, at the foot of the Cross, Jesus gave her as "Mother" to the "beloved disciple" who represented the Church full of all beloved disciples of Jesus. The Church teaches that, like the beloved disciple, we welcome mother of Jesus into our homes. She is the "new Eve" because, like Eve whose name meant "mother of all the living", Mary is the mother of all those who will live forever in Christ. "The prayer of the Church is sustained by the prayer of Mary and united with it in hope".

The Responsorial Psalm expresses the joy of the psalmist in worshiping in God's Holy Temple. He gives three definitions of the Lord: light, salvation, and life's refuge. Christians connect the psalmist's words, "The Lord is my light," with declaration of Jesus: "I am the light of the world; He who follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of life". Our collective response, "I believe that I shall see the good things of the Lord in the land of the living," expresses our hope of joining Christ in glory in Heaven. It is the hope we have of promised refuge and salvation, not in an earthly Temple, but in the Presence of the Triune God in the heavenly Temple at the end of our life's journey.

In the *Second Reading*, Saint Peter writes that the glory of Christ is His reward for accomplishing the work on earth that God the Father gave Him. Like the Apostles, the men and woman disciples, Mary, and kinsmen of Jesus who prayed in the Upper Room awaiting the coming of the Holy Spirit (the First Reading), the Church continues in obedient, prayerful waiting for the return of Christ the King. We pray in confidence, knowing that when Christ reveals Himself in His Second Advent that all the faithful will rejoice in His glory.

The Gospel Reading is from High Priestly Prayer of Jesus at the end of the Last Supper. The glory of Christ is the same glory that He had before the creation event. He will share His glory with all His faithful disciples who suffer for His sake and persevere in prayer and obedience until the end of their earthly lives or until Christ comes again, whichever comes first. In the meantime, we are in the world; however, we do not allow the world to seduce us into belonging to it. Jesus has prayed for us that, through the ministry of the Holy Spirit, we will continue to belong to Him and keep faith with Him so that one day we might join Him in glory!

Finally, may the Most Blessed Virgin Mary take us all in her arms, in order to bring us into Heaven, where the silence of God allows us to hear the sighs of the Spirit!

Feast of Saint Rita of Cascia, May 22

Saint Rita of Cascia (1381-1457) had the opportunity to live her life as a wife, mother, widow and eventually a member of a religious community.

Born in central Italy, Saint Rita felt the calling to become a nun, but was pressured at a young age into marriage. During her 18-year marriage to a cruel man, she raised two sons. When her hus-

band was killed in a brawl and her sons died, Saint Rita decided to go back to her first love and attempted to join the Augustinian nuns in Cascia. Her status as a widow caused some complications to her entering, but she eventually succeeded in professing vows. Throughout her lifetime, Saint Rita of Cascia was known for her prayerfulness and charity. She also experienced stigmata on her forehead, meditated frequently on Christ's passion and cared for the nuns of her religious community and those in the lay community who came to her for counsel.


Question of the Week

Jesus, having completed the work of his Father, speaks of returning to Him and of being glorified. As we share in Christ's glory, we too share in His suffering. We have nothing to fear, however, since the Lord is our refuge. In His name do we gather, attentive to the Spirit.

As we approach the end of the Easter season, we recall the joy we felt on Easter Sunday, a month and a half ago. More recently we celebrated the Ascension, Jesus' glorious return to the Father in heaven. At the time, the disciples returned to the upper room and "devoted themselves with one accord to prayer." We strive to do the same ourselves, as one people, one Church, praising and thanking God, for our Lord has conquered sin and defeated death.

Next Sunday, the Easter season is complete with the celebration of Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. Let us celebrate our "birthday" by prayer throughout the week for an indwelling of the Holy Spirit in our lives and by celebrating with great joy at Mass next Sunday:

Let us pray. Lord, by the light of Your Holy Spirit, You have taught the hearts of your faithful.

In the same Spirit, help us to relish what is right and always rejoice in Your consolation.


