

Fr. Marlon's Reflections - Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Jer. 20:10-13; Rom. 5:12-15; Mt. 10:26-33)



It cannot be denied that we have all kinds of fears. We experience fear when we think of tomorrow along with all the problems it brings. When there is danger that we may lose our job. For those have teenage son or daughter you worry of them. What if they go with the wrong company, knowing that prohibited drugs proliferate in our neighborhood? When we face retribution for a wrongdoing. When we are confronted with death due to terminal illness. Or when we feel all kinds of symptoms or get sick. This is especially true when we are short of money for a medical examination or medicines. Etc., etc.

As Christians, we believe that with the coming of Christ, we have been redeemed from original sin (Rom 5:12-15). But its effects - pain, suffering and death - are still with us. These are the roots of fear in us. Jesus, being human like us except for sin, was not exempt from fear. In the garden of Gethsemane, He prayed, *Father, if it be your will, let this chalice pass from me. But he triumphed over this fear by placing his fate in the hands of his Father.*

In the Gospel reading (Mt 10:26-33), Jesus commanded his disciples to proclaim his message in the same manner as he did - without fear, What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light; what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. Jesus knew that in witnessing to and proclaiming his message, the disciples would face being laughed at, opposition, persecution and even death. But he urged them, Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna.

Jesus also encouraged his disciples to always remain faithful and stand firm because *Everyone who* acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. They were not to fear because they were precious in God's eyes. To make this point more concrete, Jesus talked about God's care for sparrows, Not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge. And they were worth more than many sparrows. Thus they should not be afraid of what people would say or do to them as they carry out their mission.

Long before Jesus uttered these words, there were already great men in the past who were persecuted for proclaiming God's words. There was the prophet Jeremiah who was imprisoned for consistently pointing out the futility of resisting the Babylonian king and eventual exile. He was also aware of the plots against him. Thus from prison he said, Yes, I hear the whisperings of many: "Terror on every side! Denounce! Let us denounce him! Perhaps he will be trapped; then we can prevail, and take our vengeance on him." Yet he continued to proclaim God's message. Why? Because he knew that the Lord is with me like a mighty warrior; so my persecutors will stumble and not prevail. He firmly believed that God would protect and ultimately vindicate him.

As followers of Christ, we are also tasked to proclaim Jesus and his message to others - in words and deeds. Sometimes, this requires us to take a stand. And doing this can bring about criticism and even ridicule from people. Along this line, we can find out to what extent we will stand up for our beliefs by the way we answer the following questions: If we are the only ones at home who participate at Sunday Mass will we still go? If we know that we will not be caught committing a dishonest act, will we remain honest? Is the fear of being discovered the most powerful deterrent for us to stay away from evil or is it our desire to do God's will in all things - whether we are seen or unseen?

Jesus challenges us to stand by our beliefs even when it is disadvantageous and risky to do so. For example, we all say that we want to live in a community where justice and peace reign supreme. Yet when we witness a crime, say, drug pushing, are we willing to testify so that justice will be served? More often than not, the answer is no. And this because appearing in court may take much of our time or we fear that we will be the object of harassments or threats from the suspect or his family. If we all behave this way then we can bid goodbye to peace and order in our community. Then we can never become the light of the world that we are called to be.

In witnessing and being light for others, we are to rely completely on God's power and protection. For Jesus assured us that his Father will take care of us as he does even of the sparrows in the air.

Failure to witness before the earthly tribunal will mean disgrace before the heavenly tribunal. This is what we must fear above all. And so, let us pray always for the courage to do our best to spread Jesus' message under any and all circumstances.

our hearts of sin and prepares us for eternal life.

O Precious Blood of Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I ardently desire to consecrate myself and all the days of my life to Your love and worship. I place myself and my loved ones, in a special manner, under Your powerful protection, begging that Your benediction may ever rest upon us. O Most Precious Blood, be our light in darkness, our strength in temptation, our consolation in sorrow, our passport to heaven, and the eternal object of our praise and love. Amen. We pray to You Lord, help Your people whom You have redeemed with Your Precious Blood.

During the month of July, please pray with Pope Francis *For a Eucharistic Life*. We pray that Catholics may place the celebration of the Eucharist at the heart of their lives, transforming human relationships in a very deep way and opening to the encounter with God and all their brothers and sisters.

As we participate in this special combined appeal, together let us ask the Lord to bless the Holy Father, as well as those in need who are served by this collection throughout the world.






Appeal for Donations to Replace Boiler at Footedale Worship Site

I would like to talk to you today regarding the boiler situation in our Footedale worship site. Many of you may, or may not know, that we were unable to use the boiler last year. This resulted in no heat for our church basement and complicated finding appropriate locations to hold our faith formation classes. The current boiler was installed sometime in the 1970's, making it over 50 years old. Our furnace vendor had been advising for years that a replacement would be needed, as parts for this aged unit were becoming extremely hard to obtain. Boiler failures in 2021 proved this true, as we had to call out our vendor five different times for repair work. One of the times that obsolete parts was a particular problem was two weeks prior to Christmas in 2021. The parts finally came in and the furnace was made operable three days before our Christmas Eve service.

Our faith formation program is the future of the Catholic Church and as a parish we must provide the right environment for teaching and nurturing our youth. Additionally, the new boiler will provide a backup for heating the upstairs church, if necessary.

With that in mind, the finance and pastoral councils have authorized the replacement of the boiler this summer. I am hopeful that we can raise sufficient funds and have the necessary funding in place by the conclusion of the installation. I am prayerfully asking for your support of this project. 
