
Sacrament of Baptism: By appointment. Prior to your baby's Baptism, you must be a registered, practicing member of this parish.

Thoughts from Father Anthony





Second Sunday of Advent - Year B (Matthew 3:1-12)

A couple - both sixty years old - was celebrating their thirty-fifth wedding anniversary. While walking on the beach, they stumbled upon a lamp where a genie resides. After freeing the genie, they were granted the proverbial three wishes. The man immediately said, "I want you to give me a fleet of cars!" Immediately, the wish was granted. As a follow-up, he requested again, "Give me lots and lots of cash." It was granted. Then finally, he whispered to the genie, "Give me a wife forty years

younger than me." Immediately, he became a hundred years old. Maybe the genie was stupid or maybe, he saw through the selfishness of the husband who only thought of his wishes.

On this Second Sunday of Advent, we are being challenged to prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. Thus, let us change our attitudes from being selfish to selfless love. In today's Gospel, John the Baptist gets the limelight. Ironically, his personality shuns the limelight. In his preaching, he stressed that he is not the Messiah but the one who will prepare His way. We can learn a lot from the "voice crying in the wilderness." He was bold in proclaiming the Good News of salvation and the need for conversion. He challenged the Pharisees and the Sadducees who heeded his call for baptism to produce evidences of their repentance.

As we prepare for the coming of the Lord, we cannot just rely on uttering praises and words of faith in God. They must be supported by evidence. Some fruits like forgiveness, generosity, patience, and reverence should be a good start. The Pharisees and the Sadducees were known for their external piety. John would be of no help to them if he baptized them without telling them to compliment it with good actions towards others and God. In fact, the requirement is not only good for the Pharisees and the Sadducees, but to everyone who wanted to be baptized. The fruit being asked by John is not material. A complete change of heart should do it. Of course, we are not expected to attain the highest level of goodness instantly. It is more a matter of attitude and heart than time.

To infuse the faith dimension in our earthly journey, St. Peter (Second Reading) reminds us to accept and embrace the Lord as our faithful companion, as a co-pilgrim. The Lord shows "generous patience" in handling our missteps and hard-headedness, or our adamant will of not following the road map he has laid out for us. In fact, he makes sure that none of us "perishes" or "strays" out of the fold. Our God is a compassionate companion who leads us to "greener pasture." He blesses every step of our journey and because of this, "one day is like a thousand years and a thousand years like a day."

Both the First Reading and the Gospel point to John the Baptist as the example and model in achieving our identity and mission as a "pilgrim people." John the Baptist sees his mission "as a voice that cries out to prepare the way of the Lord." "Proclaiming a baptism of repentance" and the "forgiveness of sins," he exhorts his followers to "follow the way of the Lord and clear him a straight path."

John the Baptist challenges us today to encounter the Lord Jesus in faith and to embrace him as the center of our personal and communal life. Our journey can easily become unfocused, confused, without a center. Our faith in the Lord Jesus is the voice that brings us close to our core and to our calling "to be holy in conduct." Confronted by the center that is the Lord, we could not but feel unworthy and unfit to "stoop and untie" his sandal straps. John the Baptist is a model par excellence of a pilgrim prophet.

The last challenge of our pilgrim status is to become compassionate with our fellow sojourners who are lost and marginalized, who are poor and overburdened, broken and unable to journey any farther. In solidarity with them, we provide the hand and heart, the face and soul of God's mercy and compassion. This could be the best preparation in the advent season.



December Faithful Challenge: Embrace Eucharistic Revival

Eucharistic Revival is alive and well in our faith community! Over the last year, thousands of people responded to Bishop Kulick's weekly faithful challenges on social media. And it truly has made us a more Eucharistic Community. In December, as we celebrate both the Advent and Christmas seasons, we urge you to once again accept his challenge and open your heart and mind to the power of the Eucharist! Whether it be placing an Advent wreath in the center of your home, attending daily Mass or a Mass with the Bishop, or even saying a prayer for the Eucharistic Revival, you join with the living Body of Christ.





Christ is making a journey into each of our hearts this Advent.
Clear away whatever blocks
His way. Make straight the path. Invite Him in.

Today we light the second candle on our Advent wreath. It is the "*Bethlehem Candle*," a symbol of the preparations being made to receive and cradle the Christ Child. May our hearts be ready to receive the Good News!

Tuesday is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe which recalls the apparitions of Mary at the hill of Tepeyac to the native convert, Juan Diego. She was declared patroness of the Americas by Pope Pius XII.

Wednesday is the Feast of Saint Lucy
She is patroness of those afflicted with diseases of
the eye and is associated with festivals of light.

Thursday is the Feast of Saint John of the Cross
He was a mystic, a poet and an ally of Saint Teresa
of Jesus of Avila. Known as the Mystical Doctor,
he authored a number of books including *The Ascent*of Mount Carmel and The Dark Night of the Soul.

Parish Family Christmas Tree - Everyone is invited to bring an ornament, unique to you and your family, to place on our Parish Family Christmas Tree.

The Christmas wafer reflects a tradition which is at least 2,000 years old. The father of the family solemnly breaks the wafers on Christmas Eve and distributes them to those present as a symbol of love and peace. These pieces are then shared with wishes for luck, health and happiness.

These will be placed on the altar and remembered in prayer throughout the Christmas season.
